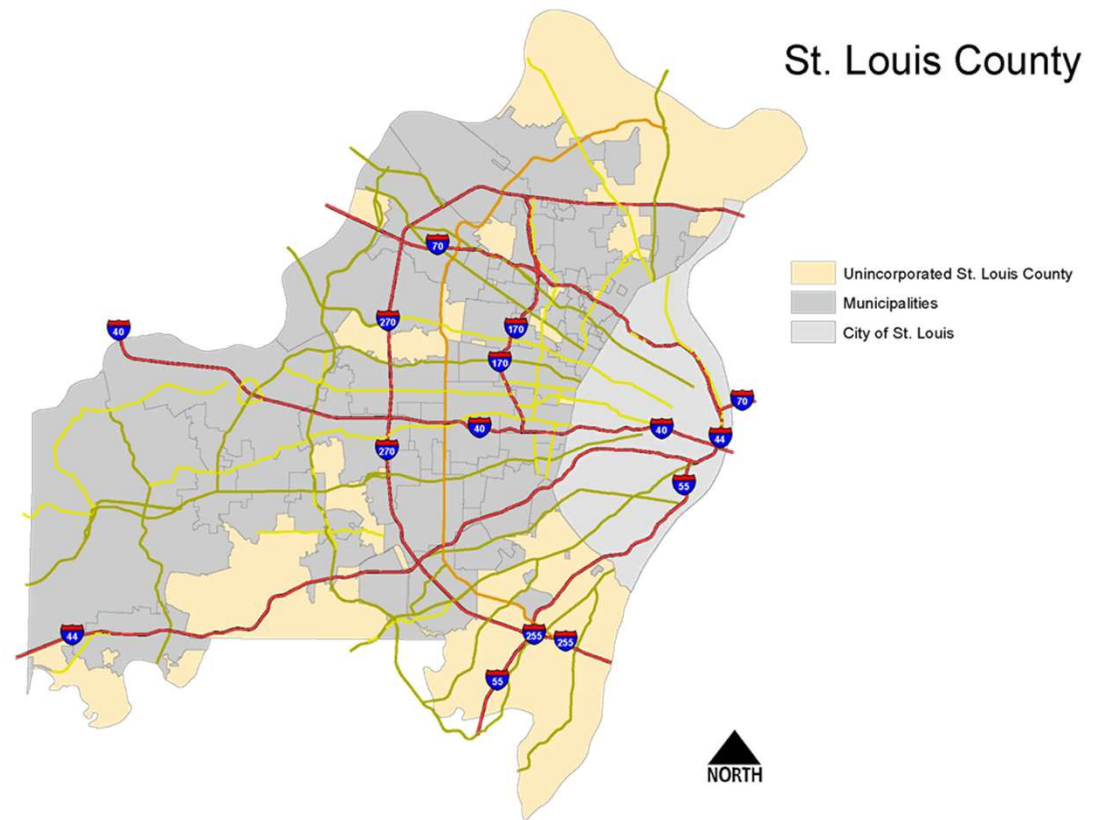
Waterford Subdivision – At A Glance

- Unincorporated St. Louis County
- 68 Residents
- 26 single-family homes and 1 common ground parcel
- 6.3 Acres
- 0.3 lanes miles of ROW
- Fully developed with no vacant lots



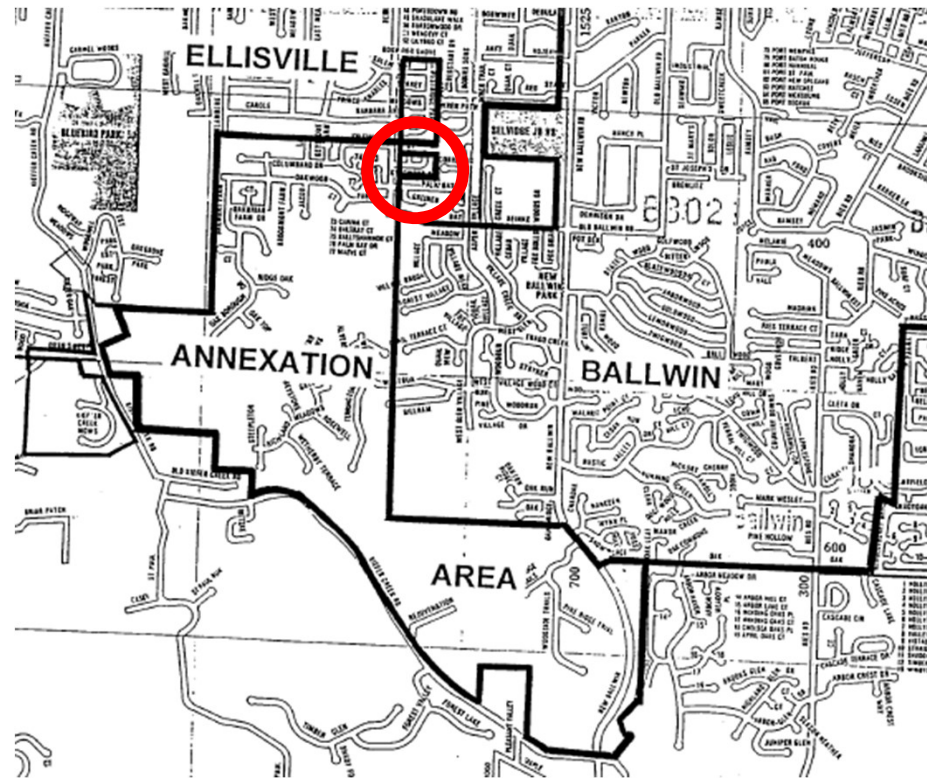
St. Louis County – At A Glance

- Total population of 1,000,000 residents
- Provider of limited services to all County residents, including election administration, arterial road maintenance, and other specialized services
- Unincorporated population of 315,000 residents
- Local service provider to all unincorporated residents, including local streets, police, zoning, *etc.*



Waterford Subdivision – An Unincorporated Pocket

- Small unincorporated pocket since October 1999 when the Ballwin Southwest Annexation was effective
- County raised concerns in 1998 regarding the leftover portions of unincorporated territory
- This action in essence corrects a 21 year issue by expanding Ballwin's jurisdiction into this area



The Issue of Unincorporated Pockets

- The Boundary Commission Rules have a precise definition, but it is essentially an area with low population density and only accessible via a roadway from another jurisdiction.
- The Waterford Subdivision clearly meets the definition of an unincorporated pocket
- Fragmented nature of jurisdictions increases the cost of service delivery
- As the local service provider for all unincorporated areas, St. Louis County government must provide a full spectrum of services, no matter how isolated or difficult it is to provide the service
- Depending on the size, location, and make-up of each individual pocket, the provision of local services may be better suited to a local municipality

Changes in Provided Services

- Annexation into Ballwin would result in changing which government provides local services
- Of particular note, streets, police, and trash services would move from St. Louis County to Ballwin
- The County is prepared to continue providing services to the area should the annexation fail

Closing Comments

- St. Louis County is the largest provider of local services in Missouri with residents and businesses benefiting from our economies of scale and expertise
 - Unincorporated residents receive high quality services at low cost
 - The County is prepared to continue providing services to the area should the annexation fail
 - The County recognizes this area is a pocket that is fully surrounded by Ballwin and Ellisville, and thus, a local municipality may be more capable of providing services in this instance
 - The County finds there to be significant support for this action amongst residents
 - As such, the County supports the annexation of Waterford Subdivision by Ballwin
